BOARD MEETING MINUTES November 23, 2021

1. OPENING

Mr. Stepp stated that he has had discussions and/or meetings with the Etna Trustees to be to get to know them and establish a good relationship. He said they are mostly gathering information at this time, but it has been very cordial and positive. Mr. Stepp also stated he was thankful for the organization that we have. He stated through his first year he has become much more aware of the work, effort and commitment that goes into running a water and sewer district more so than he was able to recognize as a customer.
