BOARD MEETING MINUTES July 29, 2021

1. OPENING

The July 29, 2021, Regular Board Meeting of the Southwest Licking Community Water and Sewer District was called to order by Mr. Kretzmann at 4:00 p.m. The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Mr. Kretzmann. Mr. Kretzmann, Mr. Platte, and Mr. Stepp were present at roll call. Also present were Josephine Carrelli, CJ Gilcher, Andrew King, and those members of the public who signed the sign in sheet. The meeting was also live streamed for public viewing.

2. ADOPTION OF AGENDA

Mr. Kretzmann made a motion, second by Mr. Stepp, to approve the agenda as presented. Upon roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried. Agenda adopted.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mr. Kretzmann made a motion, second by Mr. Stepp to approve the minutes of the Regular Meeting of July 8, 2021, as presented.

Upon roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion Carried.

4. PAYMENT OF BILLS

Mr. Kretzmann moved to approve payment of the bills as presented. Mr. Stepp seconded. Upon roll call vote, all voted aye. Motion carried.

5. **COMMUNICATIONS**

There were no communications to report.

6. PUBLIC COMMENTS

Mr. Jim Duffy stated he read through the report provided at the last meeting regarding the Refugee Road sewer study and thought the cost seemed pretty high. He asked if it was to replace the existing pipes or would they run a new bigger one beside the old one.

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Mr. Gilcher stated it was a high level cost estimate and they wouldn't know the actual number until the engineering costs and the project was bid. He thinks it was for replacement. He explained the process for replacement.

Ms. Deb Moore wanted to know who was going to pay the \$10 million for the upgrades. She wanted the Board to reassure the customers that they would not be responsible for the cost. She said the developer should be completely responsible to pay for the upgrades as they chose the land to develop.

Mr. Kretzmann responded and said the intent of the Board has always been for the developer to pay the cost for the upgrades.

Mr. Duffy said it would have been nice to prepare for future development when the pipes were initially installed and hoped it was something they are thinking about during current construction.

Mr. Kretzmann stated they could only use the tools they had available at that time. Mr. Stepp added that there are more financial tools today to be able to utilize than there would have been during the creation of the District.

7. GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT

TIMMONS TEST WELL PROJECT UPDATE:

Mr. Gilcher stated they are still waiting on the well screen. It was projected to be constructed in 6 weeks and is shipped out of California and they are still in the time frame for that to happen.

HOLLOW ROAD WATERLINE EXTENSION PROJECT:

Mr. Gilcher stated they continue to head north on SR310. Mr. Gilcher and Mr. Sims went to view the booster station in production last week and had no complaints. It should be delivered to the site in the next couple of weeks.

Mr. Stepp wanted to again state that he continues to stand firm in his belief that existing customers should not be responsible for the costs for future development.

Mr. Kretzmann stated that has always been the desire of the Board.
