Dear Resident,

The Southwest Licking Community Water and Sewer District has nearly completed the installation of a new 12" water main from the existing water tower located in the Lexington Woods subdivision in Harrison Township along Hollow Rd and Hazelton Etna Rd to the final stopping point of Worthington Rd and SR 161. A special assessment will not be levied against property owners along the water main and residents will not be required to connect to the system, however, The Board of Trustees have determined that a **voluntary** 10-year assessment will be allowed for those **Residential** customers who would like to connect to the system.

For those residents who do wish to connect to the system, the cost for a **residential** ¾" **service** to connect is \$6,771.00. This includes the tap fee, capacity fee and the meter fee. For those customers who want to do the voluntary assessment, there will be an interest charge of 1.69% and a 3% fee charged by the Licking County Auditor to manage the assessment. Those individuals who would like to sign up for the 10-year voluntary assessment must call the office and schedule an appointment to sign the paperwork. You have 6 months from the date of this letter to sign up.

Commercial tap fees are calculated based on each individual business. Please call the office for information on commercial tap fees. Homeowners must follow the rules of the District in making a connection to the system (contract with a District approved contractor, schedule to have work inspected, well abandonment or backflow prevention device installation, etc.) All rules are on the website or questions can be answered by calling the District office.
